Baxter, long-time wildlife biologist with the Nebraska Game & Parks Commission who was a champion of early ring-necked pheasant research and having strong conservation programs associated with the Federal farm bill. The award will be presented to students pursuing a graduate degree in the wildlife field at any accredited graduate school in the United States. Applications are not limited to, but priority will be given to schools located in or work be conducted in the Midwest. The funding is in addition to any assistantships, stipends or scholarships already received. Applications are not limited to, but priority will be given to applications and proposals that are related to upland game bird life ecology, habitats, genetics, management and the support of upland hunting.

Funding Distribution: Awards are announced and distributed annually at the Pheasants Forever State Habitat Meeting in Nebraska. Applications for 2012 are due by January 5, 2012 for distribution on February 4, 2012.
