

Site visits and bidding procedures:

- Each contractor expecting or hoping to bid on projects within the Loess Canyons, North Platte River and/or Republican River project areas must attend at least one contractor workshop, unless other arrangements are made to get information.
- Each contractor or a representative of each contractor is expected (not required) to visit each site that they offer bids on. A contractor may contact Nebraska Game and Parks Commission (NGPC) staff, other partnering agency staff or project site landowner(s) if they want to have an on-site visit prior to bidding on a project.
- Project sites and specifications for each site will be posted on a website where contractors can download legal descriptions, aerial photographs with project plans on them, acreage measurements, and a brief description of the project.
- After reviewing a project site and other details associated with the project, a contractor may submit a bid to the appropriate NGPC staff member (listed with locations farther back in this document and on project descriptions on website) up to the point where the project information is removed from the website.
- Bids must be calculated on a “per acre” basis. Contractors that have worked with NGPC or other agencies are probably familiar with this process. For those that are not, we suggest that you look over the project site, estimate the hours that the project will take, determine a total cost and then divide that out by the number of acres to get the dollars per acre estimate.
- Bids must follow the specifications listed below (in section III), or as amended within any project site description on the website.
